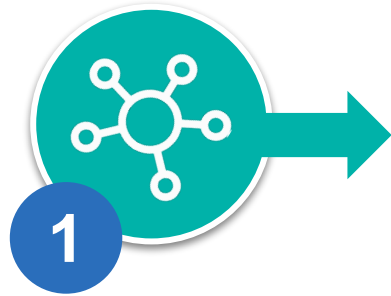

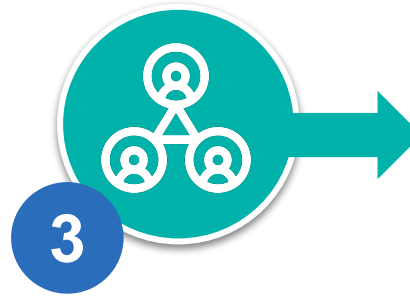
Informing Authors about the Open Access Agreement

BMJ Author Hub assists researchers and Authors at every stage of the publishing process.

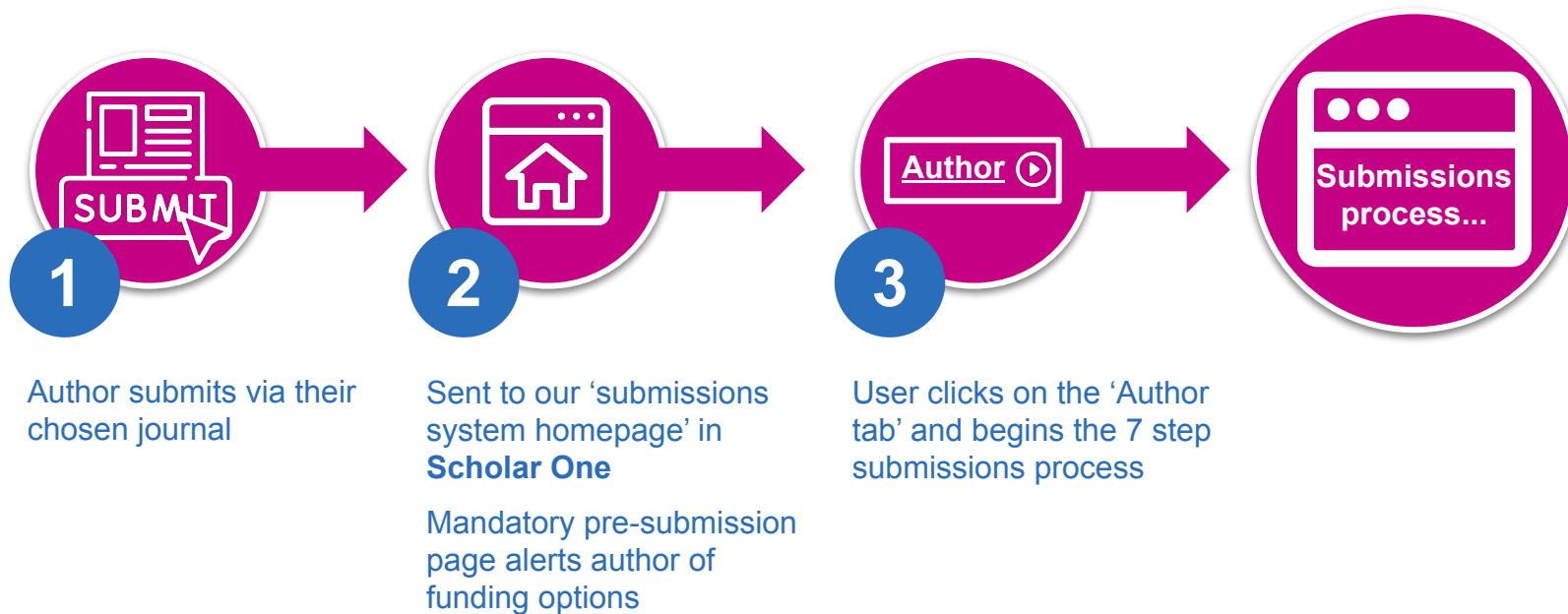

7 step submissions process



1. Type, Title, & Summary/Abstract



2. File Upload



3. Attributes



4. Authors & Institutions



5. Preferred and Non-Preferred Reviewers



6. Details & Comments



7. Review & Submit



BMJ Author Hub - there will be links and prompts throughout the steps to remind Authors to look back at the Author Hub for full information on the steps and requirements and eligibility.

Key steps under Open Access Agreement



4. Authors and institutions

Author connects Ringgold ID to determine eligibility for APC discounts (link to Author Hub)



7. Review and submit

OA opt-out. Additional licence reminder and invitation to return to step 6 if necessary. Funding eligibility reminder (links to Author Hub)



6. Details and comments

Author to select licence preference. Alert to specific licence requirements under OA Agreements (links to Author Hub)

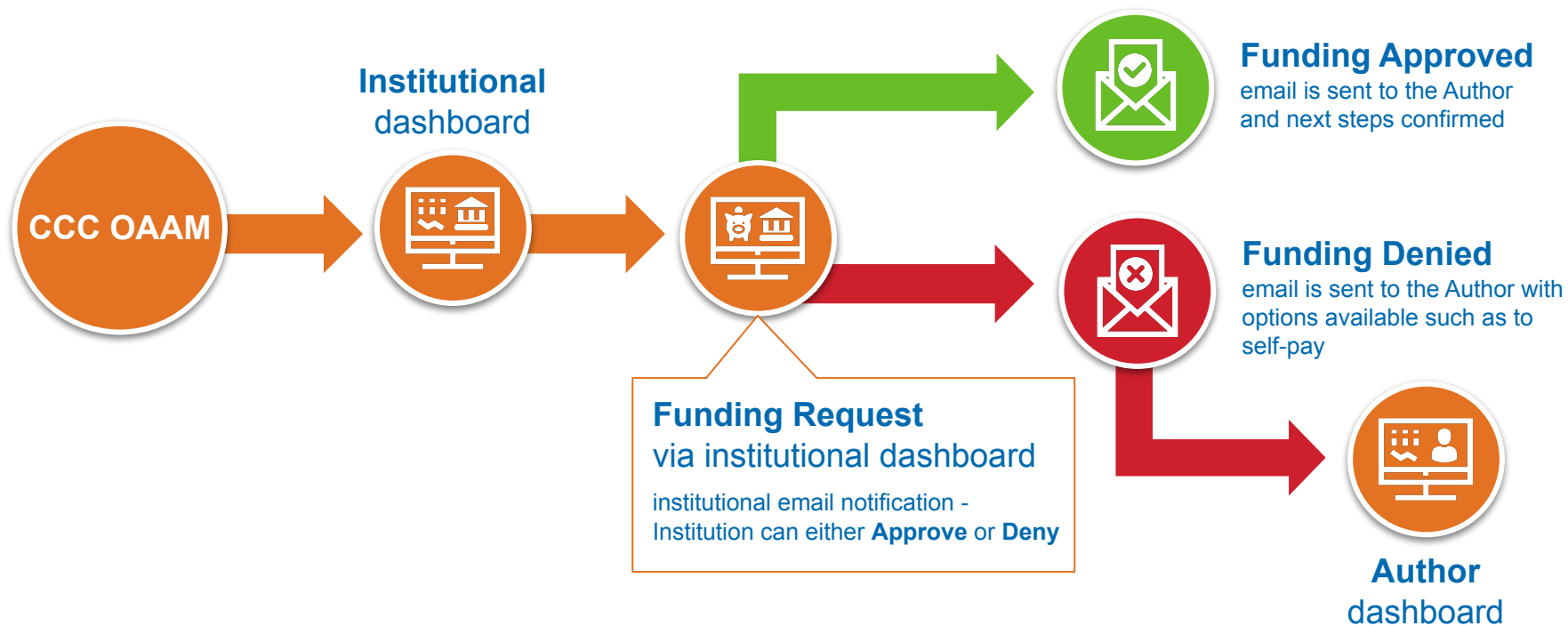

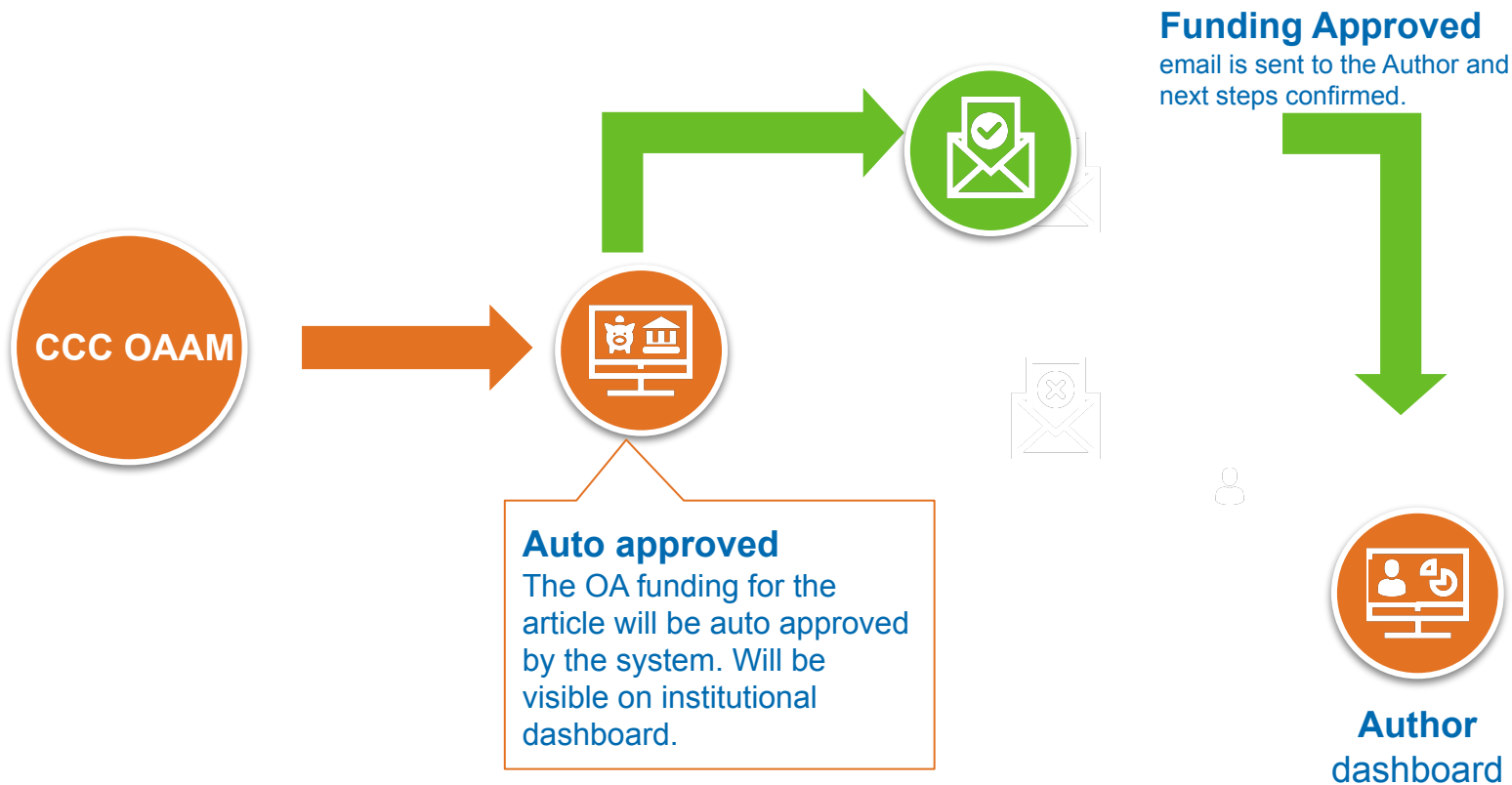

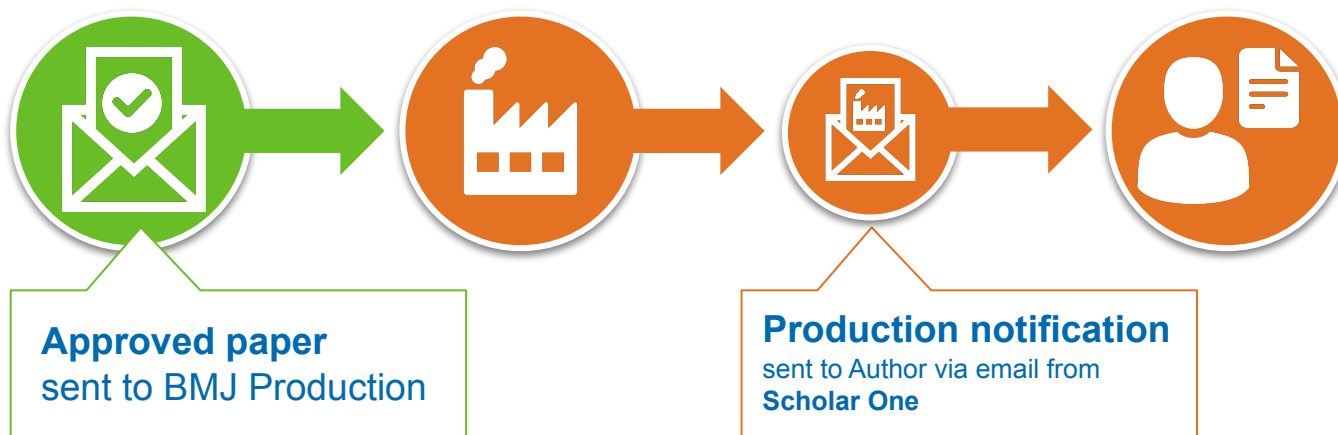
