

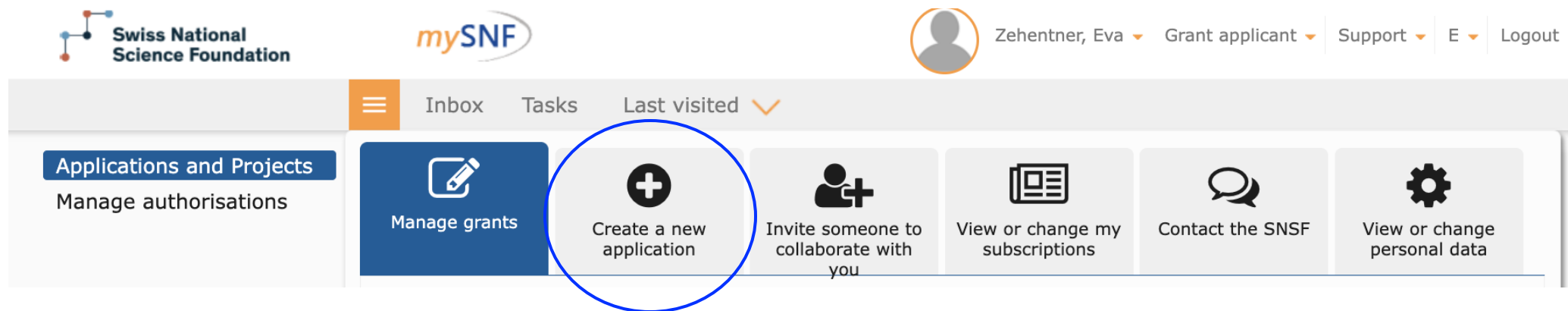

We are gradually replacing the online platform mySNF with the new **SNSF Portal**. Since July 2023, project funding applications must be prepared and submitted via the **SNSF Portal**.

An exception applies to Weave/Lead Agency applications evaluated by a partner organisation. These must continue to be submitted via mySNF for formal review.

From 2025 onwards, applications for COST and the bilateral call with South Korea must also be submitted through the **SNSF Portal**.

Calls for further funding instruments will be opened in the **SNSF Portal** in 2025 and 2026. Please note that any preparatory work done in mySNF cannot be transferred to the **SNSF Portal**. 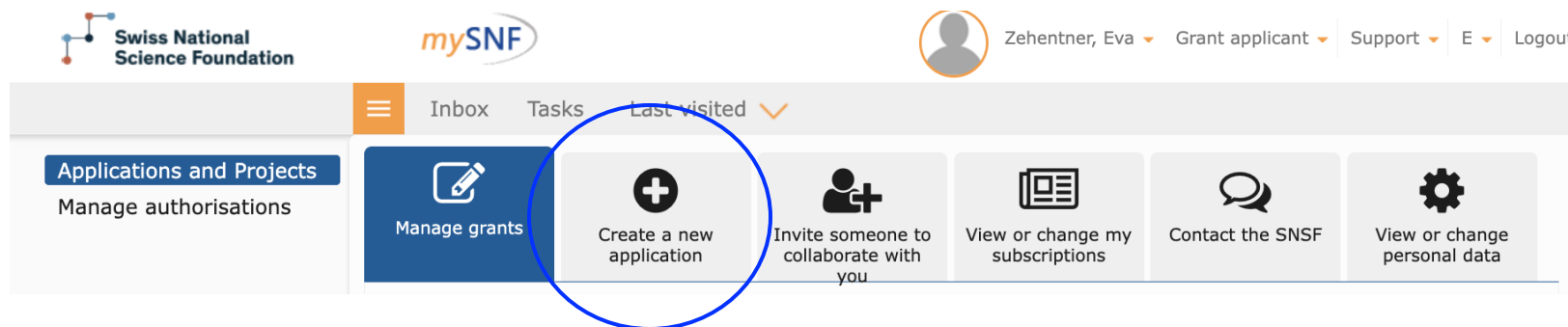
OA books

- **peer-review requirements**

- publisher responsible for quality assurance
- at least one external, independent, meaningful written review
 - publisher invited to submit review via mySNSF
- peer-review process documented in writing
 - signed and dated statement
- reviewer independent from applicant/ authors and publisher
- reviews of book proposals not accepted (entire manuscript)
- edited volumes: peer review for volume as a whole and individual contributions
- dissertations/ habilitations: thesis examiner reports accepted
- applications can only be submitted once reviews have been conducted and manuscript revised

OA books

- application for **‘Scientific Communication – Open Access Books’** on *mySNF*
- application submission any time, decision typically within 2 months
- application by author of book/ member of editorial team
- general requirements for submitting an SNSF-application
- main applicant: employment of at least 50% at Swiss institution at time of application
- result of SNSF-funded research OR carried out at Swiss institution (?)
- submission possible after end of grant timeframe (if applicable)

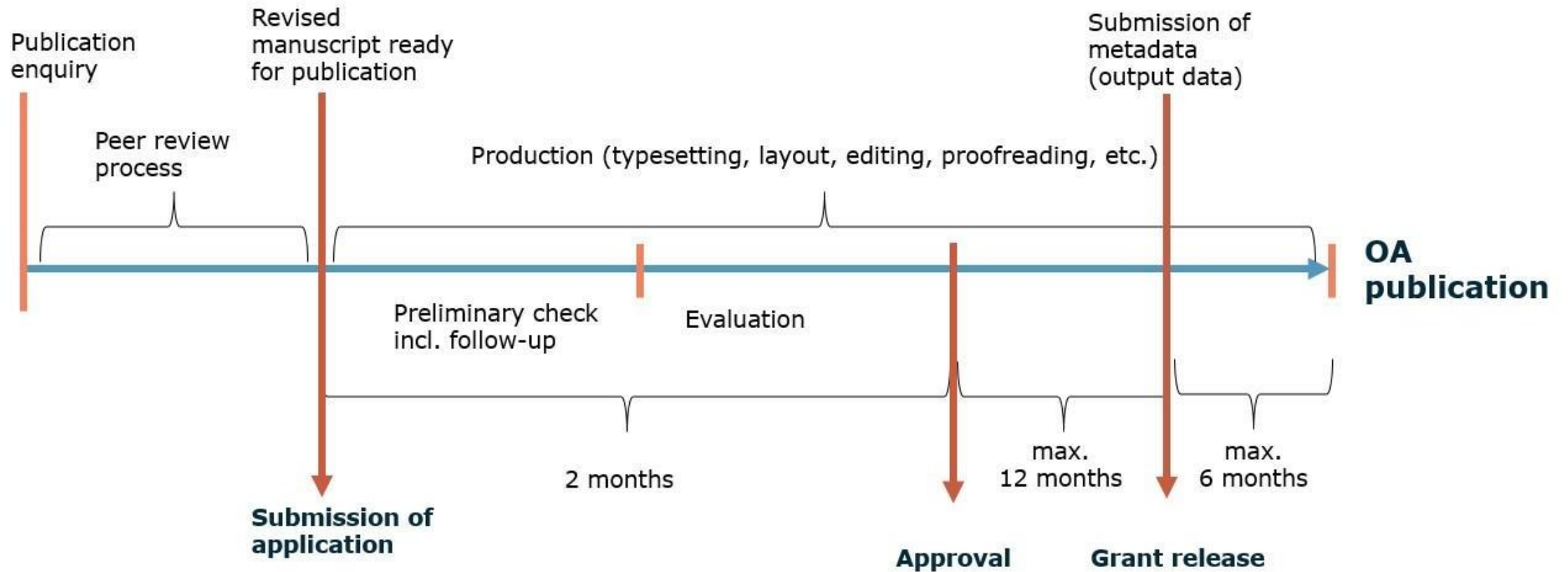
- **decision and payment**

- after evaluation, applicant is informed of decision within 2 months (no publication before)
- grant recipient requests release of funds on *mySNF* (within 1 year after decision)
- SNSF pays approved grants/ invoice directly to publisher
- payment exclusively in CHF
- value added tax (VAT) must already be included in requested amount
- SNSF \neq addressee of contracts, invoices, reminders \rightarrow contracting parties = grant recipient and publisher
- book must be published within 6 months of grant release
- OA online publication at same time as print version at the latest

OA books

- **copyright page of OA version**
 - mention of SNSF's funding of publication (acknowledgement)
 - minimum requirement: CC BY-NC-ND (Creative Commons: created by, non-commercial, no derivative), recommendation: CC BY licence
 - DOI number (Digital Object Identifier)
 - ISBN number (if additional versions, e.g. print, separate ISBNs)
 - year of publication
 - author/ editor also deposits book publication in institutional or discipline-specific repository
 - SNSF forwards OA publication along with metadata to Swiss National Library and OAPEN Library

- 11 grants per month in 2018, 15 grants per month in 2019
- by the end of 2019, 3.6 million CHF for 235 open access books/ on average 15,400 CHF per book
- most grants awarded in humanities
- 50% of book publication within 15,000 CHF limit
- 6% interactive content (further funds)
- 54% in German, 25% in French (further funds for proofing in other languages)
- 73 publishers in 8 countries (45% Switzerland, 43% Germany)



This volume brings together twelve empirical studies on ditransitive constructions in Germanic languages and their varieties, past and present. Specifically, the volume includes contributions on a wide variety of Germanic languages, including English, Dutch, and German, but also Danish, Swedish, and Norwegian, as well as lesser-studied ones such as Faroese. While the first part of the volume focuses on diachronic aspects, the second part showcases a variety of synchronic aspects relating to ditransitive patterns. Methodologically, the volume covers both experimental and corpus-based studies. Questions addressed by the papers in the volume are, among others, issues like the cross-linguistic pervasiveness and cognitive reality of factors involved in the choice between different ditransitive constructions, or differences and similarities in the diachronic development of ditransitives. The volume's broad scope and comparative perspective offers comprehensive insights into well-known phenomena and furthers our understanding of variation across languages of the same family.
